#### CV Professors & Guest lecturers

**DR. CAROL COSGROVE-SACKS** is a Professor at the College of Europe. From 1994 to 2005, she was the Director of the Trade in the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) in Geneva. An experienced and respected economist, professor and manager, she was educated at the London School of Economics, and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics, a Masters in European Economic Studies and a Doctorate regarding trade relations with the European Union. Prior to joining the United Nations, Dr. Cosgrove-Sacks was an international business consultant.

**TÂNIA FELÍCIO**, is project researcher at UNU-CRIS since 2003 her current research project is "Regional Security and Global Governance: A study of Interaction between Regional Organizations and the UN Security Council". In the context of this project she co-authored the book "Regional Security and Global governance: A study of Interaction between Regional Agencies and the UN Security Council with a Proposal for a Regional-global Security Mechanism". In the last year, Ms. Felicio has also been working as a consultant for the United Nations Department of Political Affairs, for the High-level Meetings between the UN Secretary-General and the Regional and other Intergovernmental Organizations.

**KNUD ERIK JØRGENSEN** is Associate Professor, Jean Monnet Professor in European Politics at the Department of Political Science, Århus University (Denmark) and Visiting professor in the institute of European studies at the Free University in Brussels. Previously, he was Visiting Professor at the Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Research at the European University Institute in Florence. He has contributed chapters to numerous edited volumes and published articles in journals such as the Journal of European Public Policy, European Journal of International Relations, Governance,

Journal of Common Market Studies and Cooperation and Conflict. He is currently preparing a monograph on European foreign policy and a new textbook on IR Theory.

**DIETER MAHNCKE** is Director of Studies at the "European Political and Administrative Studies Department" and the newly established "EU International Relations and Diplomacy Studies Department" at the College of Europe in Bruges. Moreover, he is Alfried Krupp von Bohlen und Halbach Professor for European Foreign Policy. From 1980 to 1985 professor Mahncke was Advisor to the German President and Deputy Chief, Planning Staff, Defence Ministry in Bonn until 1996. He is the author of books and articles on European security, arms control, the role of Germany in Europe, Berlin, U.S.

**NICO SCHRIJVER** is professor of International law at the Leyden University and of Cooperation with developing countries at the Institute for European studies (IEE), Université Libre de Bruxelles. He served as advisor to the Dutch Government during the 2005 UN general Assembly. He is author of many books on international law and on international cooperation including, as co-author: "The United nations of the Future. Globalization with a Human Face", Kit Publisher Amsterdam 2006

**ANTONIO VIGILANTE** is the Head of UN and UNDP Office in Brussels. He previously worked as UN Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative in Egypt and Bulgaria. From May 1999 to August 2000 he was also Special Representative for Post-Conflict Development in South Eastern Europe. Mr. Vigilante is the author of many publications related to development issues in specialized reviews and books as well as newspaper articles, in addition to 3 books on other subjects. He has directed from January 1995 to July 1996 a UNDP bi-monthly Human Development Review. He is visiting lecturer to a number of post-graduate courses in Italy on international relations and development.
